As some of the longstanding members of the Etobicoke community may know, the Goldhart Ranney Lecture is an event which is rich in tradition.

The first Goldhart Ranney Lecture was held in 1979. It was funded by the generosity of Irwin Goldhart. Mr. Goldhart was an active member of the hospital's Board of Governors and served on many key committees. He also contributed generously to the hospital's Building Fund.

The Lecture was also named in honour of funding sponsor and leading community champion and Board Chair, Kenneth Ranney.

Over the years, a long and impressive list of speakers has presented at the Lecture. These have included Apollo 13 Captain James Lovell, Dr. Thomas Starzi, a pioneer of kidney and liver transplantation;

Next up: Accreditation Canada onsite survey September 30 - October 4

The accreditation survey is less than one week away. Accreditation Canada surveyors will be onsite at Osler from September 30 – October 4. Here are the top eight things that you need to do to help us reach our goal of "Accredited with Exemplary Standing:"

- Know that all staff, physicians, volunteers and students can be interviewed during a tracer by an Accreditation Canada surveyor.
- Be familiar with quality improvement initiatives on your unit and across the organization. A great example is the performance huddles.
- Be prepared to talk about how you collaboratively meet the needs of patients and families through communication and transfer of accountability. For example, change of shift, breaks and patient transfers to another unit or agency.
- Know how your unit's objectives support the goals of the organization. You

An 'Urban Hero' among us!

Dr. Tina Meisami, an oral and maxillofacial surgeon at Etobicoke General Hospital, has been awarded a 2012 Etobicoke Guardian Urban Hero Award for her volunteer work in providing free dental and orthodontic treatment to abused women in the Toronto area.

Treating abused women

Three years ago, Dr. Meisami initiated the Dr. Borna Meisami Commemorative Foundation in honour of her brother Borna, an orthopaedic surgeon, who passed away five years ago. Through connections with women's shelters in the Greater Toronto Area, Dr. Meisami and a number of dental colleagues treat abused women,

which has a positive impact on their road to recovery. The program, 'Restoring Smiles', goes beyond the treatment of teeth and facial features.

"Many women who come to us suffer from anxiety, depression, self-confidence issues, and social stigma because of teeth that are missing, discoloured, or broken," said Dr. Meisami. "It is incredible how correcting teeth can empower a woman and inspire confidence so that she might obtain a job, enter into a healthier relationship, and live as a happier, more independent member of the community."
